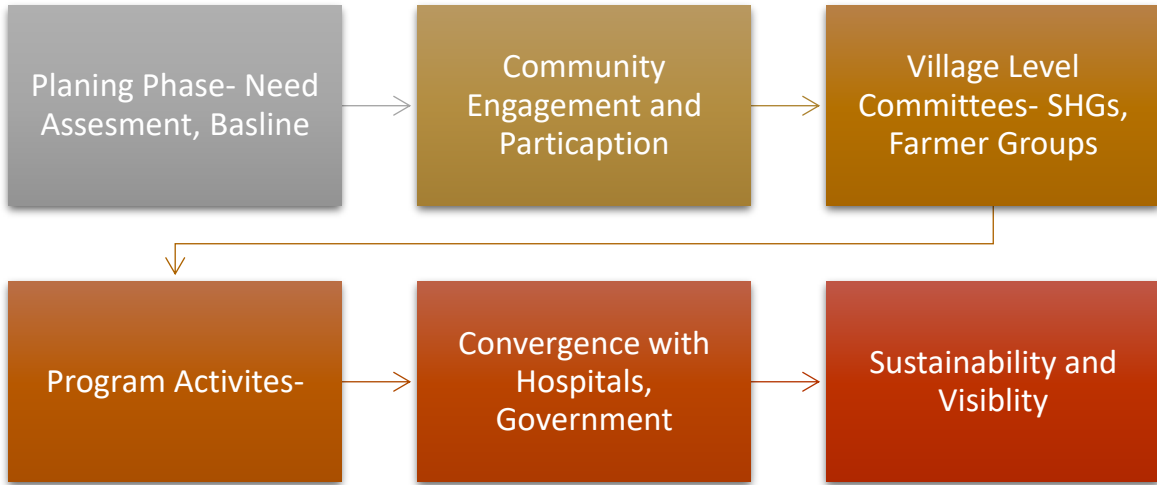

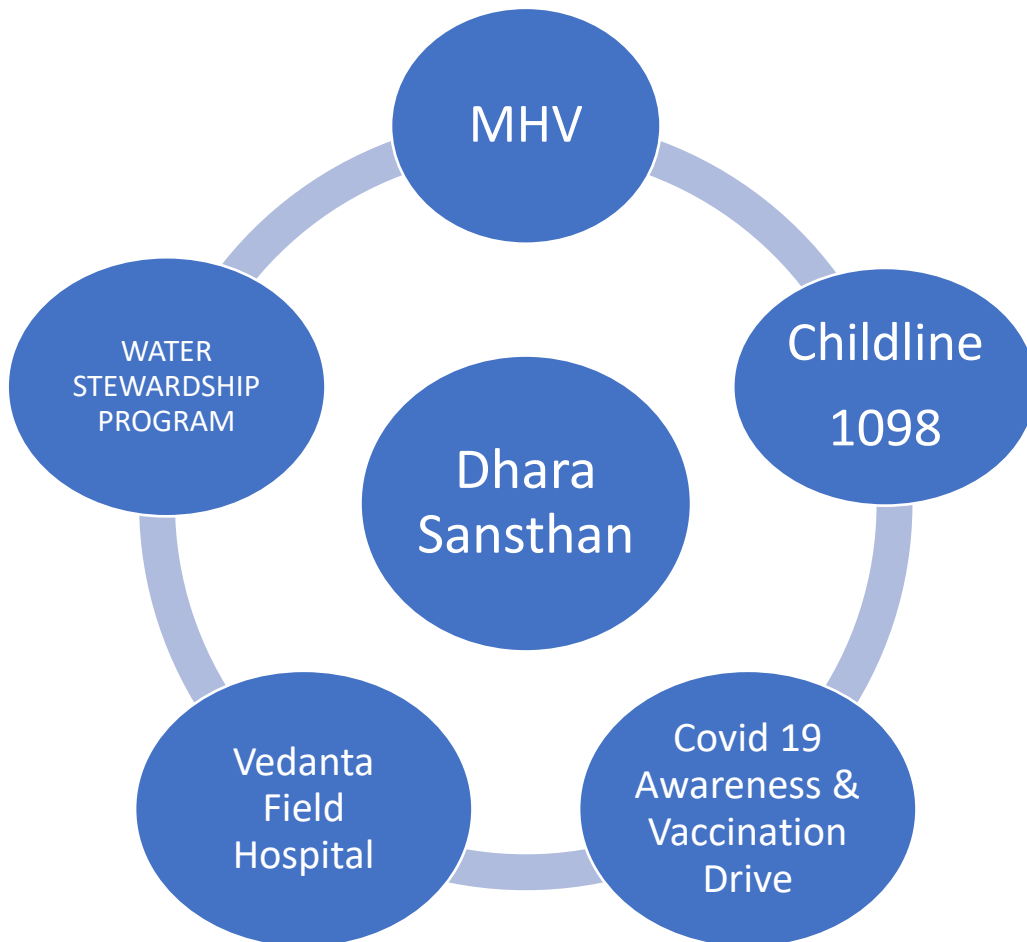

Mobile Health Van



Vedanta, Cairn Oil & Gas has supported Dhara Sansthan for Executing Mobile Health Van project along the pipe line route. The basic purpose of Cairn was to initiate health-based intervention in the pipeline villages to address the need of health services and to increase its footprint in those villages.

Mobile health program was started from the village Hariyali on 15th of August 2010 by Dhara Sansthan with the financial support of Vedanta Cairn Oil & Gas.

The objective of this program was to provide health care services to the pipe line villages of Vedanta Cairn Oil & Gas and to create awareness among the villagers regarding various diseases. Every program has two kinds of objectives, one is short term objective and the other one is long term objective.

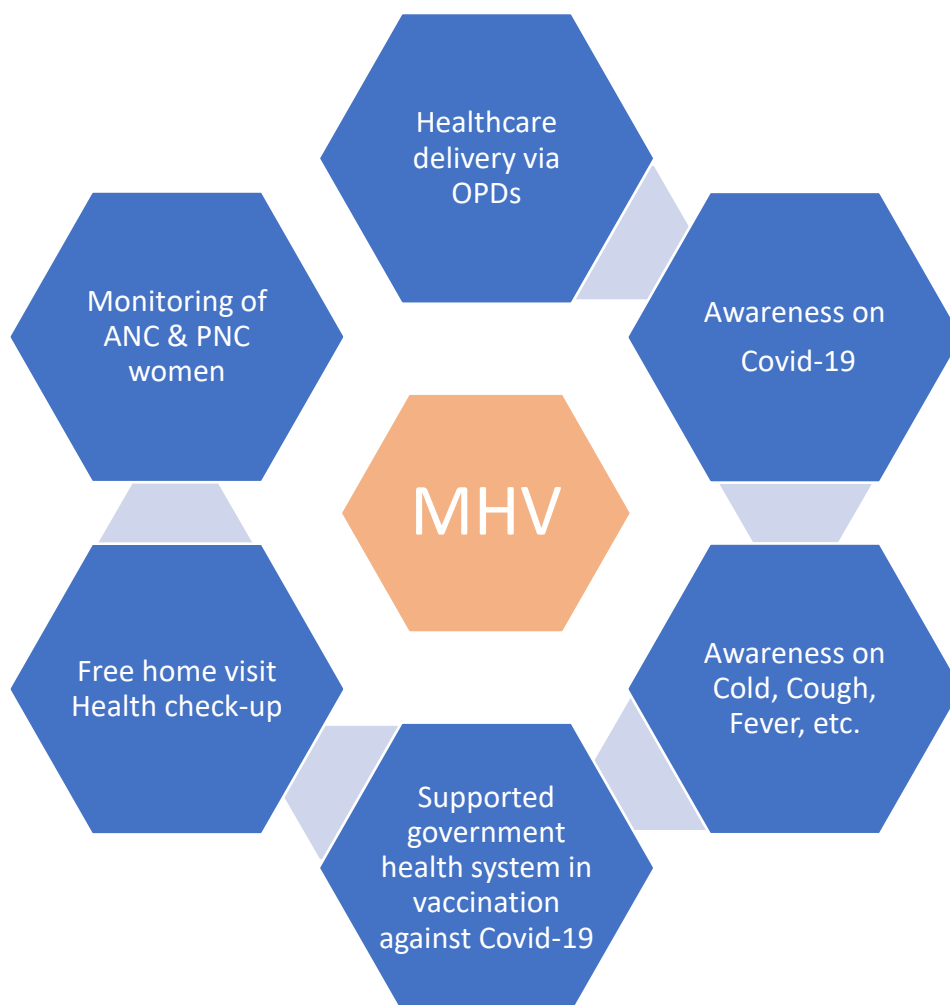
- Short term objective here is to provide the health care services at the door steps and to guide villagers to live healthy life.
- Long term objective is to create awareness among the villagers regarding different diseases and to share the information on the methods to protect oneself from various diseases. And if anyone is suffering from any disease, then they are referred to sub center or hospital for curative medication.

The components of the project are designed in such a way so that the community will be benefitted by the medical treatment with a qualified doctors at the door steps and also the awareness camp and events will be organized in the CAIRN operating villages.

The MHV Team includes full time staffs in the program such as- MBBS doctor, ANM, and a pharmacist is responsible to carry out the program, a full-time project coordinator is looking after the overall management of MHV and liaison with different government bodies.

Awareness camp have been Organized in the target villages for generating awareness among villagers regarding diseases like seasonal diseases, Malaria, Diarrhea, Chicken Guinea, Skin, Infection, Swine flu as well as awareness about the source of quality nutrition which are prevalent in the respective villages.

MULTI-SPECIALITY HEALTH CAMPS

Multi-specialty health camps were organized by various units of Dhara Sansthan at different locations, wherein more than 700 OPD patients were examined and medicines were distributed free of cost.

The Medical Camps make sure that people are getting healthcare at the right time, and seeing the doctor early enough before a small health problem turns serious.

In the starting, women and girls from the nearby locality started to gather at the venue, as they all have already been informed via public announcement and other means of mobilization activities. Many of the women and girls had to be transported to the venue by various vehicles from far away hamlets and villages. Finally, we got an overwhelming response from the villagers and large number of peoples thronged at the venue.

National Deworming Day:

On 10th February we decided to celebrate National De-worming day at the village of Dhakdi & Bhojva on 11th February. We Informed Gov. ANM, Asha worker and Anganwadi Woeker of Dhakdi & Bhojva village on 10th February about our plan to gather potential beneficiaries next day. We reached Anganwadi centre of Dhakdi & Bhojva after finishing our regular wok of MHV. There were around 35 children and their mothers present there. We gave ``ALBENDAZOLE`` tablet to children above the age of 5 years and for children below five years we provided syrup of ``ALBENDAZOLE``. Our ANM informed all the parents about cause of deworming and told them to keep their surroundings clean, to give cooked food to children

Covid-19 Awareness Camp

Believing strongly in its vision and mission, Dhara Sansthan always provides helping hands to the government agencies for sustainable impact of tasks being carried out different levels through various mediums. Since, organization is working actively in providing healthcare services to the rural population by the means of Mobile Health Vans, it shows its commitment for the same cause. In total, there are 7 MHVs of Dhara Sansthan which are running effectively in providing medical help to the villagers at 8 different locations across Rajasthan and Gujarat. Organization's flagship program of MHVs is a boon for the population which are



not effectively connected with medical infrastructure. Since, the organization's prime focus is on health sector, so as the news came out of vaccination of school children to protect them from corona, Dhara Sansthan thought to make use of its human resources available, those who are expert in their areas of healthcare, to help at local level to medical teams of PHCs in the process of vaccination and in this endeavour only, the organization decided to send its resourceful team to various locations in order to help the local health workers because of fast pace of process of vaccination of government schools' children.

Apart from going into public at village and hamlet level, MHV teams, also took part in creating awareness among school going youngsters related to Covid-19. At school level, MHV team members, keep in touch with the Head masters of schools and AMN, AWWs and ASHAs of the locality and provide helping hand, as and when required.

HOME VISITS

As and when required, MHV team use to pay home visits for the patients those who are not able to walk down to the MHV. Doctor use to examine the patients at their houses and they were provided with the required medicines without any charge.

No. of Beneficiary: Total around 1300 sanitary pads were distributed to women and girls who are reached by our team.

Benefit: The safe and secure menstrual period for all the women in the villages

ChildLine - 1098

Supported by Childline foundation India, Ministry of Women and Child Development, Government of India, CHILDLINE started in 1996, India's first 24-hour helpline service supported by the Ministry of Women & Child Development. The service is for children in need of aid and assistance and is provided through a toll-free 24- hour emergency phone service (1098). Apart from responding to emergency needs, it also helps in linking children in difficult circumstances with various services meant for their long-term care and rehabilitation. This one-point contact is meant to facilitate instant access to support, guidance, and active intervention.

1. **Management of Focused Intervention of CHILDLINE at community level was done by meetings, as mentioned below:**

- ❖ **Weekly Meetings with Staff Members-** 43 weekly meetings with staff members.
- ❖ **Monthly Meetings-** 12 monthly meetings with team members.
- ❖ **Directors' Meetings-**4
- ❖ **Numbers of Volunteer Meetings-**4
- ❖ **Resource Organization meetings-**2

2. Details of Awareness and Outreach activities coordinated at city level:

Various awareness camps were conducted at various places in Barmer. The purpose of organizing camp has been to aware people at mass level regarding the social and traditional evil practices which are killing the rights of children. It is important to address these issues and provide the sound and child friendly environments for their appropriate developments.

The second purpose of organizing the camp was too aware the people about the laws and rights given to the children in the constitution of India. Even the government had made a separate law to protect the children from violation.

Various awareness camps were organized at different village in Barmer in which we distributed masks to Aanganwadi Centers as per their necessity.

3- Other Programs in Child Line

- ▶ Setting up CHILDLINE hoardings and logos in Govt. Schools, police stations, main street circles, Railway stations, markets, main streets, etc.

- ▶ Gathered information about the children involved in Child Labor, rag picking and beggar and Share the cases (Profile details) with Police Department for further action also awareness created of COVID-19 vaccination.
- ▶ Survey on rag picking children and linking them with ICDS and schools.
- ▶ Organizing awareness program for tobacco & cigarette addicted children as well as counselling & providing medical assistance.
- ▶ Setting up CHILDLINE hoardings and logos in Govt. Schools, police stations, main street circles, Railway stations, markets, main streets, etc.
- ▶ Organizing Joint Meeting with Asha & AWW for motivating them to support deprived children for medical assistance & restoration & linkage with school.

4. Bal Club Formation:

In the reporting period April 2021 to March 2022, we follow-up all the Bal Club to achieve the objective of Bal Club and produce the child friendly environment intended for the development of children.

Though the program of child line – 1098, team members visited the Schools, community and remote area of Barmer district. During the visit of schools, we used IEC materials, Using Visual Kit (Projector) to show the awareness and using different method & tools to reach out

the message of Child Line – 1098 mainly for the purpose of organizing awareness camp and conducting dialogue between us. In the program we work out on the theme of Child Rights, Child Marriage, Child Labor etc. To enhance the knowledge of the students we organized competition on the above theme. The best performed children were awarded with prizes by Child Line – 1098.

Awareness programs was organized for providing assistance to the person with disability, children who have been deprived of education, Child rights, Child labor, COVID-19 awareness and vaccination, Immunization etc. We also distributed educational kit to the unprivileged and deprived students in different schools.

5- COVID-19 Relief awareness and food distribution program -

- For identification of the children's, who need care, protection and food. We done survey of slum areas of Barmer district children's who need food support. We provided the data to administration for the help of these children's.



- For providing the relief material to the peoples who affected form lockdown. We arranged relief material like Flour, lentils, oil, salt, toothpaste and brush, Shaving kit, Mask and Sanitizer etc. for these peoples with support of local donors. Environment minister Mr. SukhramVishnoi, Barmer MLA Mr. Mevaram Jain, District Mr. Mahindra Choudhary and chief Chairman of Nagar Parishand Mr. Dilip Mali flag off the truck of relief materials.



- We done survey of slum areas of Barmer district and we got the data of the children's and poor peoples, who deserve ration items. We provided relief material like Flour, lentils, oil, salt, toothpaste and brush, Shaving kit, Mask and Sanitizer etc. to these peoples with support of local donors.



- Team distributed masks among various Aanganwadi Centers of Barmer district. Team also told them to wear the masks as well as maintain social distancing in their center. Team also gives advice to them to wash their hands frequently.

- ❖ Increase the Irrigated area through water harvesting & conservation.
- ❖ Recharge ground water level through water harvesting.



A strategy based on grass root realities and community perception had been developed to Facilitate effective implementation of the project at the grass root level.

- ICU ward of VFH used to be cleaned four times a week, which gets dirty while remaining closed. After cleaning it the ICU ward was being properly arranged and closed again.
- Apart from this, the entire field was getting cleaned 3 times a day and all the dirt and garbage used to be disposed of at a designated place.
- Toilets and bathrooms which were closed, those were also being opened for regular cleansing.
- Visit of a team from Jaipur Government Hospital had been facilitated. The team saw the entire premise and did inspection of all the vital areas and installations.

- From 19th of October 2021 onwards, the hospital was operationalized and admission of dengue patients was started in a full-fledged manner.
- Since, the VFH started functioning at full capacity, then every day, in the morning, evening and at night, cleansing and dusting of wards, bathrooms and toilets was started by the staff.
- All other rooms such as doctors' room, staff room and cabins built in the VFH, had been cleansed completely and were put in order nicely.
- Dirt and dust spread by patients' care takers and visitors in the gallery where AC is installed, those areas were cleaned and the dirt was disposed of in a proper manner.
- After the discharge of the patient, beds were cleaned and rearranged properly. Used bedcovers and pillows were sent for wash and sanitization.

Fogging was also done with the help of health department in the entire premises of VFH, in order to keep it safe keeping in view the good health and well-being of the admitted patients.

- Garbage of the VFH was disposed of on daily basis through the garbage van sent by municipal corporation.
- Watering of plants was done daily which are planted in the premises.
- Any other works assigned by Mr. Tanmay Wadkar, Mr. Aninash Chouhan and Mr. Ravipratap Singh, were done.
- On daily basis, total 11 employees were engaged in three shifts, details are mentioned below:
- Apart from this, two supervisors, supervised and monitored the activities in the shift of 12 hours daily.

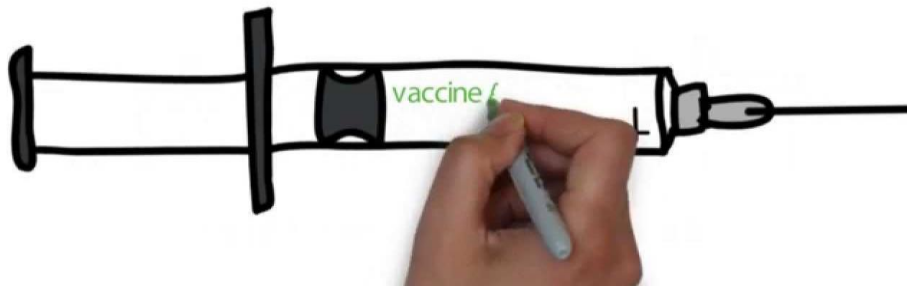

Covid Vaccination Drive

VACCINATION IS IMPORTANT



Access to health care is a common challenge for rural and frontier communities due to provider shortages, insufficient broadband Internet availability, geographic location, among other issues. During the pandemic, additional challenges surfaced including a lack of trust and concern about the COVID-19 vaccine's safety.



The project aimed at targeting and identifying all those who still have their vaccination doses left to take. Some, who have taken the first shot and have not turned up for second shot would also remain the major beneficiaries for this project. The project will target the blocks in each district where vaccination coverage is low and target has not been achieved as planned.

The project was initiated in the month of March 2022 in the districts named: Barmer, Jaisalmer and Jalore. Profile of population to be reached are disadvantaged, marginalized and vulnerable communities those who have not been vaccinated. Majority of the target population works as a marginal farmers, informal workers, rag pickers, traditional artists and urban slum dwellers.

Key Strategies Planned for Project Implementation are as follows:

- Street plays (with Kalbeliya & Manganiya artist groups of community)
- Organising meetings with VHSNC
- Pamphlet distribution
- Home visits to vulnerable sections
- Mapping based on initial exercise on hard-to-reach areas
- Orientation of frontline workers/ local level leaders
- Regular review of vaccination
- Convergence with existing



PHC/CHC/DH; reporting Adverse Effect Following Immunization (AEFI).

- Collaboration with state/ district level immunization cell
- Smooth vaccination round in the proposed blocks
- Vaccination camps in hard-to-reach areas in consultation with district immunization cell.

Till the end of March 2022, **total 3237** peoples were vaccinated and the beneficiaries belonged to varied communities of all the three assigned districts.



Conclusion -

In conclusion we would like to say that the program “Mobile Health Program” has bringing some significant reflection in summarizing our level of satisfaction in contributing towards reaching the poor people of interior village areas with the potential support of Vedanta, Cairn Oil & Gas. And we also grateful to Vedanta, Cairn Oil & Gas for initiating such an impactful program to the remote villages of Barmer district, where the poor people used to suffer even for very common diseases due to poor transportation facility and remoteness of the areas. At present days our beneficiaries of the targeted villages are getting all the general medical assistance to maintain a quality of healthy life within their own community.
